1 Introduction

2 Local Trainings

The senior members have been training throughout the year at the UNSW Village Green in partnership with UNSW Lacrosse. The playing squad has grown throughout the 2022-23 season due to a number of new members and we are looking forward to an exciting second half of 2023 on the pitch.

3 Junior Wombats Lacrosse Academy

For the first time in recorded history, lacrosse was available through Lacrosse NSW to juniors outside of the Sydney region in New South Wales! Held at the Adamstown Public School between May and June of 2023, over 20 of Newcastle's newest lacrosse players gathered for a five-week program that featured fundamentals, game play, and much more. With the support of the local community, Lacrosse NSW will look to schedule additional programs in the Newcastle area for later in 2023 and beyond. An enormous thank you goes to Katie Byrnes, Dennis Juleff, Michael Augenstern, and Ryan Landels for helping to initiate and drive this historic program for Lacrosse NSW!

Additionally, two Junior Wombats Lacrosse Academy programs were held at the South Coogee Public School in October 2022 and April 2023. With many returning faces, as well as some new players to the game, the juniors located in Sydney built on the fundamentals that they learned in the previous versions of the program held last year. Lacrosse NSW would like to thank Tim Anderson, Tim Koodrin, and Kyle Doctor for the planning and execution of the Sydney juniors' programs this season.



4 East Coast Cup

Despite getting off to a hot start and an undefeated pool play on both sides of the brackets, both the men's and women's teams came in second place at the East Coast Cup held at the Gold Coast Recreation Precinct in Palm Beach, Queensland, on 15-16 October 2022. The teams were led by tournament MVPs Josie Cox and Kyle Doctor, who anchored the NSW women's defence while in goal and led the attack for the men's squad respectively.

NSW will look to exact revenge when the East Coast Cup is held in western Sydney later this year.







5 Indoor National Tournament

While we were unable to assemble a full roster, numerous members from NSW played on the men's President's team at the Indoor National Tournament held at the new Alan Lewer Box field in Newport, Victoria, between 9-12 February 2023. With a concoction of mostly players from NSW, the President's team surprised many by securing two victories during pool play – defeating Western Australia and Queensland. Additionally, one NSW member, Georgina Owens, competed with the Western Australian team who won a silver medal at the tournament's inaugural women's competition.

6 Senior Nationals Tournament

After a few years of absence, Lacrosse NSW sent a women's team to the Senior Nationals Tournament held at Sturt Lacrosse Club in St. Marys, South Australia, between 7-11 June 2023. The women played admirably with some excellent results, particularly against the eventual winners, South Australia, and in their narrow 14-13 defeat to Queensland.

Lacrosse NSW would like to extend a significant thank you to Lizzie Crouch for running the women's training and development since January 2023 and for coaching the women at Nationals. Her efforts both on the field and behind the scenes are greatly appreciated! A huge thank you also goes to Caroline McLuckie for managing the team so efficiently, allowing the team to focus on the game at hand.

NSW resumed its rivalry with ACT as the Battle in the Capital took place on 25 June 2023. Both the men's and women's squads swept the day, winning all four of their games. NSW looks forward to returning the favour when we host ACT in western Sydney later this year.


